Characteristics of Pre-COVID Dual Enrollment Students

They required more management than the typical college student.

They had parents. For example, parents (and some high school administrators) were caught off guard by FERPA.

On-site: Delivery at local high school

On-campus: Students come to college campus

Online: Any form of virtual delivery

Characteristics of Post-COVID Dual Enrollment Students

They require even more management than before.

Characteristics of Post-COVID Dual Enrollment Students

They are still high school students. This is even more significant with increases in on-site classes.

They still have parents.
But with increased
enrollment, statistically
there will be more
parents with limited or
no college background.

They are even more mixed up than before.

Dual enrollment for the foreseeable future is going to be a significant factor in higher education.
